





In the USA, the native, large beetle Prionus Californicus or root borer beetle is a serious pest of cherry as well as other stone fruit and hardwood trees. The adult beetle can reach 2 1/2†in length and the grub 3 1/2â€. It is a large beetle with long, segmented antennae and falls into the category of Cerambycidae or Longhorn beetles. The larva eats among the roots and buries into the trunk making large circular tunnels and weakening and often killing the tree and making the lumber worthless due to it's damage to the inner heartwood. Infected trees can be detected by the small piles of wood dust and frass visible at the base of the trees.

Other common destructive pests of cherry lumber are the peachtree moth and twig borer beetles and  $I\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}^{m}$  d be remiss to fail to mention the occasional woodblock hobbyist.
